

Oakdale West Industrial Estate - Overview






- Archaeological survey:
 - An archaeological survey of the study area, in accordance with the Code of Practice, was completed on 21 October 2015;
 - The survey resulted in the identification of five (5) new sites and an area of archaeological sensitivity;
 - A search of the AHIMS database was completed during preparation of the survey report, which identified three (3) previously recorded AHIMS sites within the study area.






Test excavation:

- Test excavation program was completed across eight days (2 11 July 2018);
- The test excavation program involved the placement of 40 pits, dispersed across 8 transects;
- The test excavation program resulted in the recovery of 34 Aboriginal objects and the identification of five (5) new sites.







ACHAR:

- An ACHAR was completed for the study area, on 25 January 2019;
- All 13 identified sites were assessed as being of low archaeological significance;
- It was found that only 8 of the 13 identified sites would be impacted by the proposed works:
- It was recommended that a surface collection program be completed prior to the commencement of the proposed works;





- Surface collection:
 - The surface collection program was completed on 24 September 2019;
 - Only two previously identified sites could be relocated and collected;
 - Two additional surface artefacts were identified and collected:





- Reburial (TBC):
 - It is recommended that all Aboriginal objects recovered be reburied within the study area, in a location that will not be impacted by future works.





Site Works Update – Internal Infrastructure

- Current Activities:
 - Planting to the Western Bund completed;
 - Retaining Wall infrastructure for Pad 2B RW to North completed, RW to South nearing completion;
 - Retaining Wall to western boundary underway RW & Noise Wall due for completion by 31 Oct 20;
 - On-going sewer installation works;
 - Stormwater works underway;
 - Road 01 and Road 03 Box-out works progressing;
 - Road 01/ 03 Roundabout box-out is complete;
- Programmed Activities:
 - On-going rock crushing works;







Site Works Update - WNSLR

- Current Activities:
 - Falsework to all abutments have been stripped;
 - Bridge headstocks poured;
 - Bridge retaining wall installation to Abutment A completed;
 - Kerb and gutter works ongoing throughout the road;
 - Round-about boxed out.
- Programmed Activities:
 - Installation of the bridge girders (6/08/20);
 - On-going service installation;
 - Commencement of Abutment B Retaining Wall;









Site Works Update – Lot 2B

- Current Activities:
 - Structural Steel Erection;
 - Bulk Earthworks Complete;
 - Footing installation continuing;
 - Stormwater Installation;
 - In-ground service installation;
- Programmed Activities:
 - Structural steel erection;
 - Ongoing in-ground service installation;







Unexpected Finds Protocol

- If unanticipated archaeological items are uncovered at any time throughout the life of the project the following actions must be followed:
 - Cease all activity in the vicinity of the find
 - Leave the material in place and protect it from harm
 - Erect a 10 m exclusion zone (temporary fencing/signage)
 - Take note of the details of the material and its location, take a photograph of the find in situ
 - Inform the site manager/area supervisor, who would then inform the superintendent / principal
- The superintendent / principal must:
 - Notify the Biodiversity and Conservation Division: (02) 6274 1111
 - Notify NSW Heritage DPC (formerly OEH) on the Environment Line: 131 555
 - Call the archaeologist to identify whether additional investigation is required in accordance with the conditions of approval and NSW Heritage DPC guidelines
 - Notify NSW Heritage DPC if confirmed as an Aboriginal object or relic
 - Await further advice before proceeding with work in the area.
